Moral Competence of Physician in two Hospitals Centers

In Chile there are no publications researching moral judgment of doctors, a competence of fundamental importance ¹due to the increasing complexity of medicine. Lind has created a test capable to evaluate moral judgment capacity known as the MCT[©] Lind ²³ · Our hypothesis is that physicians have a C- score around 20^4 ; that gender not influence the C-score; years of professional practice and type of postgraduate studies influence the C-score.236 physicians working in two hospital participate in the study, voluntarily and prior process of informed consent. The MCT[©] Lind was answered at the end of the meetings of clinical work of each specialty. In addition to the test, participants received an filled in an applicaton form so as to know: the years of professional practice; postgraduate studies; gender and encryption data in order to compare answers of participants at the beginning of the study and after a future intervention. Average of C- score of 20.9. Gender and kind of postgraduate studies do not have a significant influence in C- score. Years of professional experience was significant, with a negative coefficient.
